<b>Unit Overview</b>	<i>Students will research, assimilate information, draft, edit and produce a final report on an American President.</i>

<b>How will student use the technology as a tool to enhance their learning?</b>	<p><i>Students will use technology to: (a) generate research questions, (b)facilitate research, (c)assist in consolidation of information, and (d) enhance the quality of the final report.</i></p>
<b>Objective</b>	<p><i>Students will develop a research report to be presented to the class. They will use technology to assist in research and development of their final presentation.</i></p>
<b>Prerequisites</b>	<p><i>This will be the students' third research report this year so I expect them to have a basic understanding of keeping Bibliographic information while researching. I also expect them to have a basic understanding of using the internet to search biographies. The students will also be expected to know basic keyboarding in order to type a final report. Students will also be expected to save work on the school server so it can be accessed from any computer on the LAN.</i></p>

<b>Does this unit involve the use of technology</b>	<i>Yes</i>
<b>Required Hardware</b>	<i>Any computer in the school, classroom set of laptops, and use of a local printer. I will need a projector to show whole class demonstrations.</i>
<b>Required Software</b>	<i>Internet Explorer, Microsoft Word, and for some students-Power Point. For one student I am going to try Dragon Speak.</i>

<b>Preparation</b>	<i>I will have a letter to the students and parents explaining the assignment and the expected Timeline of due dates. I will need to have reserved the mobile lab for this project for at least some of the research days and development of report.</i>

<b>Instruction</b>	<p><i>My method of presenting projects like this one is to show examples of what the final project should look like. I also teach the process they will be going through including pre-teaching skills of equipment/software use.</i></p> <p><i>The students must see that the final product is to inform others about their President. Without effective research they will not have the information they need to have an informative presentation. Therefore, we will start with how to record research and to document where the information came from. My students will have already done Bibliographies on one research project about Life Changing Scientists.</i></p> <p><i>We will go into more detail and reinforce the methods of documenting information from encyclopedias, and the Internet. I will also be teaching at the beginning, that this report is not so much about the President's life, but about their presidency, and the changes they influenced as President.</i></p> <p><i>The underlying concept behind these reports will be "Our choices, How do the choices we make influence or change the society in which we live?" I will want each student to consider that concept as they research their president. "What choices did the president make and how did that impact America at that time?"</i></p>
<b>Modifications for Special Needs Students:</b>	<i>I will be using Dragon Speak, which changes speech to text, for one student</i>
<b>Modifications for Gifted Students:</b>	<i>I will be using Power Point for my Gifted Students in order to provide an opportunity for creative presentation.</i>
<b>Motivation</b>	<i>Being able to use the computers for both research and development of final product is very motivating.</i>
<b>Assessment</b>	<i>I will know the students have reached the objective as I have periodic checks of research, and I will also see the final product.</i>
