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Grade Level: 6

Materials

All students will have access to a computer equipped with Microsoft PowerPoint.

Prerequisite Skills

Students will need to have basic knowledge of using Microsoft PowerPoint.

Lesson Objectives

• Create, plan and design PowerPoint presentation.

Anticipatory Set

Review with class the project to date. Discuss how they could convey information about their journey using PowerPoint.

Stated Objective and Purpose

Today, your travel team will begin preparing a PowerPoint presentation that will summarize the information you discovered about each country.

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Learning Activities/Procedures

Teams will select a PowerPoint template to use for their presentation. They will use rubric as a guide to completing the tasks. Demonstrate some of the techniques to get started. Ask questions and re-teach any concepts that students are having difficulty with. Monitor the progress of teams and ask pointed questions to make sure they understand what they are expected to do. Demonstrate to the class the actual creation of an appropriate slide so they can see what is expected.

Closure

Remind students that there will be more time to complete their presentations. Review what they did today and ask if there are any questions. Address those questions.

Assessment

Observe teams to check their progress using rubric as a guide.

Reflection

The students were pleased to get to this point of the unit. They have enjoyed doing presentations in PowerPoint in the past and they were eager to create their travel masterpiece. There were some technical issues that came up and I addressed them to the class. For the most part, forgetting how to do a particular task was most common. Overall, the class transitioned smoothly to this phase of the unit. I was concerned, however, that the time involved would be more than I had originally allocated. The next class period will be devoted to finishing up their presentation.
